**Marlies Hit the Road for Three Straight Games, Starting Tonight in the Steel City  
 Toronto Looks to Build Off Thrilling Overtime Victory**

**Opponents This Week:**



*(March 9):* The Marlies travel to Hamilton this evening to begin their three-game road trip to take on the Bulldogs, AHL affiliate of the Montreal Canadiens at 7:30 p.m. at Copps Coliseum. The game will mark the ninth of 12 meetings between the two clubs. The Bulldogs have defeated the Marlies in their past three matchups. In their

most recent matchup, Toronto dropped a 5-1 decision against the Bulldogs in Hamilton on February 28. After Tim Brent scored the game's opening goal in the first period, the Bulldogs scored five straight to close out the victory. The Marlies hold an all-time record of 28-14-3 against their QEW rivals. Hamilton currently leads the North Division and the Western Conference with a 42-14-3-5 record for 92 points. Hamilton's 92 points are currently four more than any other team in the conference and 16 more than any team in their division. The Bulldogs enter the week on a season-high eight-game winning streak. Bulldogs forward Brock Trotter is currently sixth in the AHL in scoring with 28 goals and 34 assists for 62 points. Left winger J.T. Wyman scored four goals and added one assist for five points in last week's three-game week. Wyman scored his first career hat-trick in the Bulldogs' 4-1 win over Adirondack on Wednesday. He currently has 14 goals and 16 assists for 30 points. Defenceman P.K. Subban set a Hamilton franchise record last week for points by a defenceman in a single season. Subban's assist in their win over Adirondack on March 3 was his 45th point of the season, setting the record. He now has 13 goals and 32 assists to go along with a plus-38 rating, which ranks second in the AHL. The tandem of Cedrick Desjardins and Curtis Sanford has been impressive this season, combining for a league-best 2.19 goal-against average. Desjardins' 1.90 goals-against average ranks first in the league; while Sanford's mark of 2.05 is third.

*(March 12):* The Marlies continue their road trip on Friday night in the Windy City when they take on the Chicago Wolves, AHL affiliate of the Atlanta Thrashers, at 8:30 p.m. (ET) at Allstate Arena. The matchup will be the fourth and final meeting between the two clubs. Toronto has earned a record of 1-1-1-0 against the Wolves through the first three games. Toronto holds a 7-4-2 all-time advantage over Chicago. The Marlies were shutout by Chicago last Wednesday at Ricoh Coliseum. Drew



MacIntyre made 19 saves in Chicago's 3-0 victory. The Wolves are currently one of the hottest teams in the AHL, winners of seven of their past 10 games (7-1-1-1) and rank first in the West Division with a record of 41-18-1-5 for 88 points. Chicago holds a record of 24-6-0-2 at home this season. They have earned a point in 16 consecutive games on home ice (15-0-0-1), which is the second longest streak in the AHL. Their 24 home victories is the second most in the American Hockey League. Former Marlies forward, Tim Stapleton, ranks third on the Wolves in points with 53 (25 goals, 28 assists). Stapleton set the Marlies single season points record last year, finishing the season with 79 points (28 goals, 51 assists), good for seventh in the AHL. He made his NHL debut last season with the Maple Leafs on February 26 against the New York Islanders. Wolves' sniper, Brett Sterling paces the AHL in scoring with 34 goals. Jason Krog currently leads all Chicago scorers, and ranks fifth in the league with 66 points (13 goals, 53 assists). Former Toronto Maple Leaf, Johnny Pohl, has notched 14 goals and 29 assists for the Wolves this season. Pohl played for the Maple Leafs for three seasons from 2005-08, registering 17 goals and 21 assists for 38 points in 114 games. Forward Spencer Machacek posted six points (one goal, five assists) in four games last week, which included three assists on Sunday. He's currently on a six-game point streak and ranks fourth on the team in goals with 17. Defenceman Paul Postma has recorded six goals and 12 points in his last nine outings after recording 11 points in his previous 39 contests. The Wolves have 12 players that have registered at least 10 goals this season.



*(March 13):* The Marlies end their three-game road swing on Saturday night with a tilt against the Milwaukee Admirals, AHL affiliate of the Nashville Predators, at 8:30 p.m. (ET) at the Bradley Center. The game marks the fourth and final match-up between the two clubs. Milwaukee enters the game with a record of 34-23-1-6 for 75 points, ranking them fourth in the West Division. The Admirals sit eight points ahead of Peoria and San Antonio for the final playoff spot in the division. Milwaukee has gone winless over their past three games (0-2-0-1). The last time these two teams met was on January 9 in Milwaukee, with the Admirals taking the 3-1 decision. Kyle Rogers scored the lone Marlie goal in the loss. Goaltender Mark Dekanich made 18 saves and was the game's first star. The Marlies are 1-1-1-0 against the Admirals this season through three games. The first two games this season were been decided in extra time. Last season the Marlies went 1-1-0-0 against the Admirals, with their win coming on January 9 at the Bradley Center. The Marlies have an all-time record of 4-8-1 against the Admirals. Forward Mike Santorelli paces the club in points with 40 (19 goals, 21 assists). Robert Dietrich ranks third in the league amongst defencemen with 18 power play assists. Dietrich was drafted by Nashville in the sixth round, 174<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft, and has posted 34 points (five goals, 29 assists).

### **MARLIES HEADLINES:**

**What Happened Last Week:** The Marlies finished their three-game week with a thrilling 3-2 overtime victory, snapping a three-game losing skid. Toronto dropped their first contest of the week on Wednesday by a 3-0 score to the Chicago Wolves. James Reimer made 32 saves but couldn't hold off the Wolves as they won their 11th game over their past 13 contests. On Saturday afternoon, Toronto couldn't solve Americans starting goalie Tyler Plante, despite firing 40 shots on goal. Mike York's first period tally was all Rochester needed as the Amerks won 1-0. Brendan Mikkelson's overtime goal with two seconds remaining gave the Marlies the 3-2 victory on Sunday afternoon over the Hartford Wolf Pack. The Marlies are currently in sixth place in the North Division with a 25-30-5-5 record for 60 points.

**Home Sweet Home:** The Marlies have played their best hockey on home ice this season, holding an 18-10-3-2 advantage at Ricoh Coliseum. With their 3-2 overtime win on Sunday afternoon, the Marlies have earned at least a point in 11 of their past 16 home contests and have won five of their past seven contests at Ricoh Coliseum. Their home game on Wednesday against Chicago was the third and final school day game and drew a season-high 7,726 fans. The Marlies have scored a power play goal in seven of their past nine home games, going 8-for-40 during that span (20.0%). Toronto returns home on March 20 with a matchup against the Hamilton Bulldogs at 4:00 p.m.

**Another Brick in the Wall:** James Reimer has guided the Marlies to at least a point in 10 of his past 13 starts (8-3-1). Over his past 13 starts, he's recorded a 0.936 save percentage and 2.02 goals-against average. Reimer recorded his first career AHL shutout on February 20, making 31 saves and earning first star honours in the club's 2-0 win over Manitoba. Reimer's shutout was the team's first shutout since October 30 when Joey MacDonald didn't allow a goal against Adirondack. In 15 games this season, Reimer has a record of 9-4-1 with a 2.23 goals-against average and 0.928 save percentage.

**We're Going Streaking:** Kyle Calder had his Marlies season-high seven-game point streak snapped on February 24 in Hamilton. The following night against Hershey, Calder scored two goals and was the game's first star. During his streak, which started on February 9 at Abbotsford, Calder recorded four goals and four assists. The Mannville, Alberta native tallied his fifth multi-point game on Sunday with two assists. Calder has tallied a point in 14 of his past 21 contests (seven goals, 11 assists).

**Keeping It Close:** The Marlies have a very impressive record this season when the game is decided by one goal, marking a record of 17-2-5-5. 17 of their 25 victories this season have come in one-goal contests. Christian Hanson and Troy Bodie share the club lead with three game-winning tallies. The Marlies own a 17-0-2-2 record when taking the lead into the third period. Toronto holds a 16-7-5 record when scoring the game's opening goal and are 20-6-6 when they score three or more goals in a game.

**Multi-Point Games:** The Marlies had three players notch multi-point games last week. Kyle Calder, Ryan Hamilton and Brendan Mikkelson each collected two-point games on Sunday afternoon against Hartford. Christian Hanson paces the club with nine multi-point games this season.

**In the Community:** The Marlies participated in their fifth of six community practices last Thursday night when they traveled to the Centennial Arena in Scarborough, Ontario. The team hit the ice at 7:00 p.m. for an hour long practice and then had a full team autograph signing afterwards.

**Reading Report:** The Toronto Maple Leafs ECHL affiliate, the Reading Royals currently rank second in the East Division with a 30-25-1-3 record for 60 points. The Royals knocked off the Kalamazoo Wings on Sunday 6-5 in overtime for their second straight win. The Royals have won five of their past seven games. Stefano Giliati has notched eight points (four goals, four assists) over his past two games. Robert Slaney has collected an assist in each of his past two contests. Slaney has registered one goal and eight assists in 16 games with Reading to go along with 10 penalty minutes. In 34 games this season with the Royals, Giliati has recorded 39 points (17 goals, 22 assists). Andrew Engelage has been in goal for both of the Royals' past two victories.

#### **MARLIES QUICK HITS:**

- Tyler Bozak notched his fourth goal of the season for the Maple Leafs last Thursday night in Toronto's 3-2 shootout loss to the Boston Bruins. Bozak currently ranks first on the Leafs in face-off percentage (55.4%).
- The Marlies recalled Greg Scott, Alex Berry and Joey Ryan from the Reading Royals on Friday afternoon. They all skated in the Royals' 6-3 loss to Kalamazoo last Thursday night and all collected one assist each. For Berry it was his first career ECHL game.
- Andre Deveaux currently leads the team in goals (14), power play goals (five) and penalty minutes (180) and is tied for first with 33 points.
- Defencemen Brendan Mikkelson's overtime winner on Sunday was his first game-winning goal of the season.
- Ryan Hamilton's two-point output on Sunday (one goal, one assist) was his first multi-point game of the season.
- Toronto has won seven of their past nine games when they've out-shot their opponent.
- Brennan Evans' 168 penalty minutes currently ranks second in the AHL for defencemen and 11th overall.
